Mr. Romanella’s talk is about where we are heading with the Space Shuttle and Space Station programs as well as the United States’ robotic exploration of the solar system and our plan to return to the Moon and on to Mars.



Russell Romanella is the Associate Center Director for Engineering and Technical at NASA’s John F. Kennedy Space Center. Previous assignment include International Space Station director where he was responsible for all ground processing of Space Station elements getting ready to fly in the space shuttle. Mr. Romanella joined NASA in 1981 as a student while attending Florida State University where he later received his degree in mathematics and computer science. Mr. Romanella’s broad range of experiences include space shuttle processing and the International Space Station. Mr. Romanella has received numerous achievement and performance awards, including NASA’s Exceptional Service Medal and the Center Director Award and the 2008 Presidential Rank Award for his leadership in preparing Space Station elements for launch from KSC.
