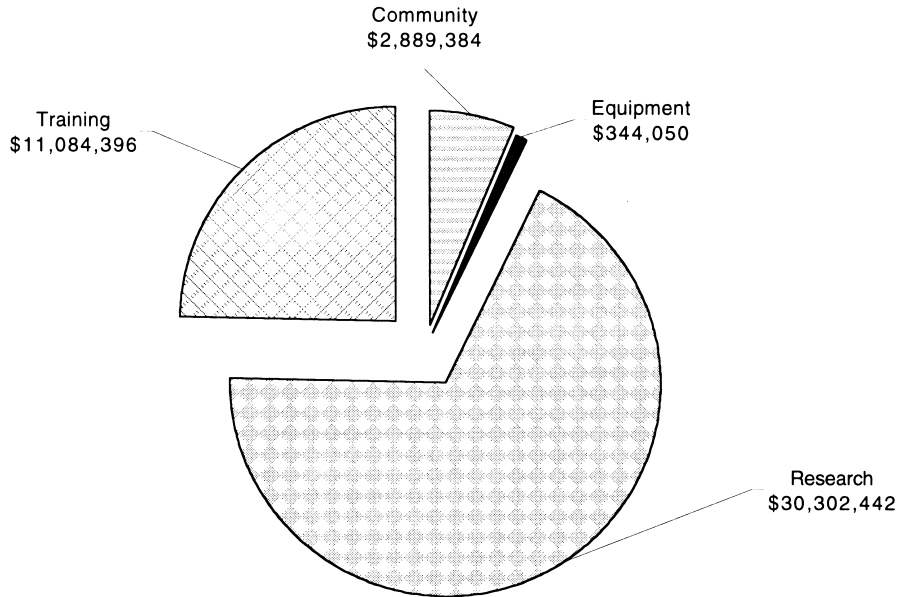
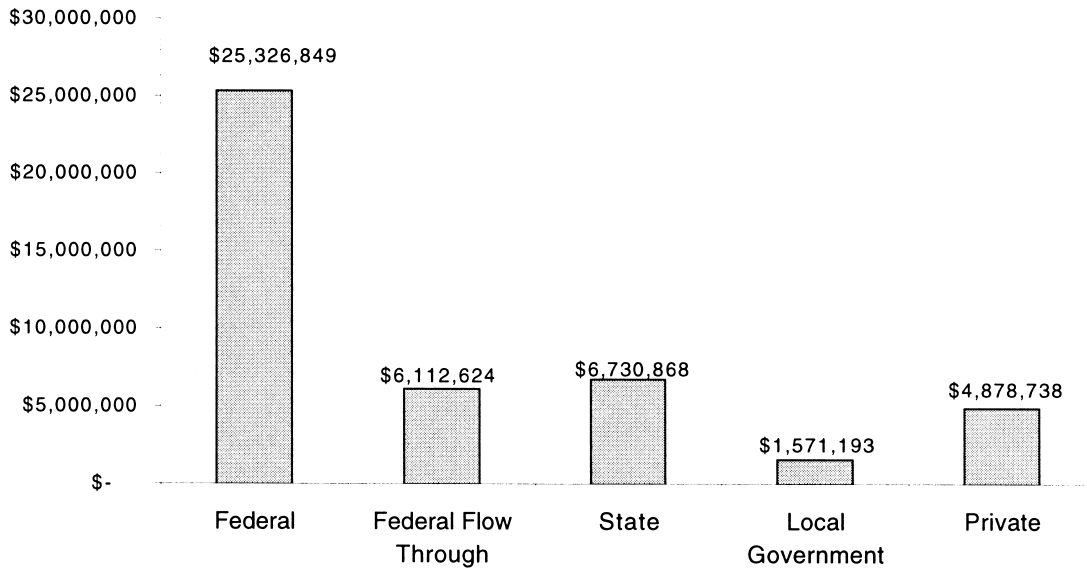


## Funding by Service Type
