**This schedule is a tentative plan for the term and there may be minor changes during the term in order to ensure that we cover all needed material prior to each examination.*

Pre-Requisites: 1 year of General Chemistry (CHM 1045/CHM1046) with a grade of C or better.

Grades: There will be four mid-term examinations (100 pts ea) and one final comprehensive exam (300 pts). The lowest exam grade will be dropped but **you are expected to take all exams. There will be NO Make-up exams**, if you miss an exam that will be the grade dropped. You must earn a C on the final exam to obtain a C or better in this course. Total points will be 600 pts. Final grades will be based on the distribution: C ≥ 60%; B ≥ 75%; A ≥ 87%.
